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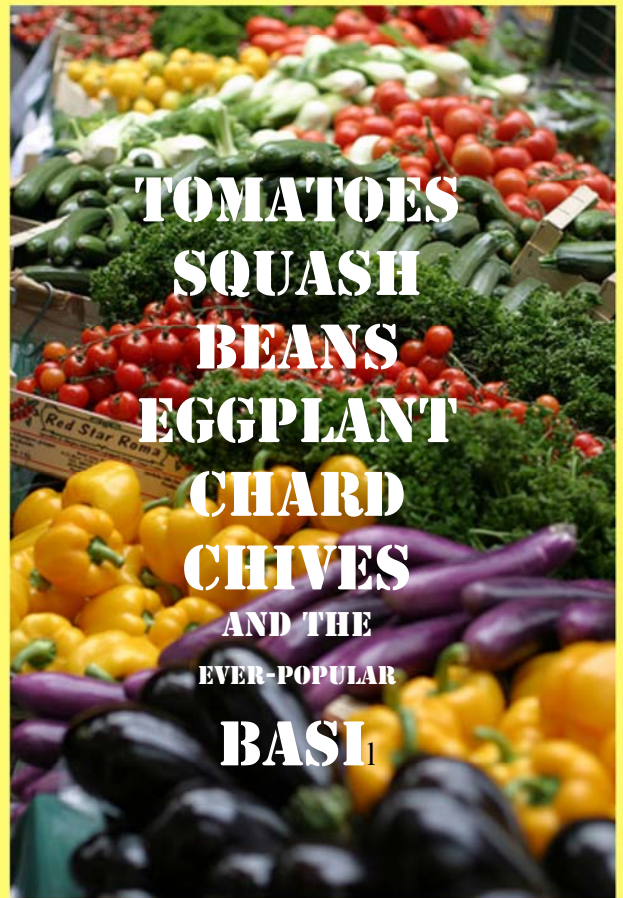

### Stuffed Nasturtium Blossoms

24 Pesticide-free nasturtiums  
1/4 c Cream cheese, at room temperature  
24 Capers

Place nasturtiums on a tray or large platter.

With butter knife, press about 1/2 teaspoon cream cheese into center of each nasturtium

Pat capers dry on paper towels. Push a caper into the center of the cream cheese in each flower.

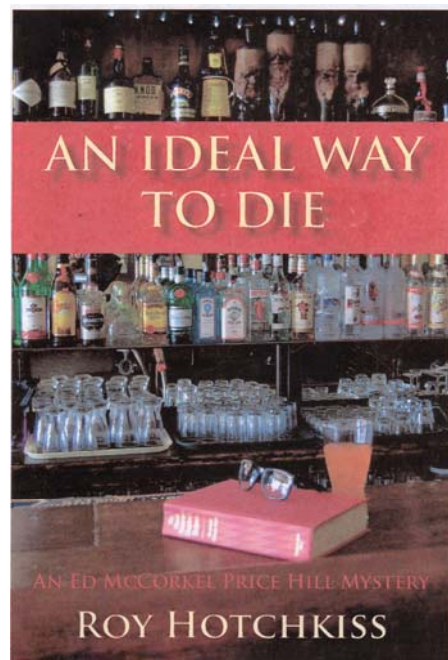

He does this during the first part of World War II in and around the Ideal Café, where he deals with the many colorful characters who live in the area and frequent the café.

During his adventures, he visits the famous carnation nurseries of Delhi, where he meets a cult of Tom Mix worshippers. (Tom Mix was an early cowboy movie star.) He takes part in a riverboat chase and learns the secrets of "Jack Salmon". . . But wait, if I tell you much more you won't have to read it.
